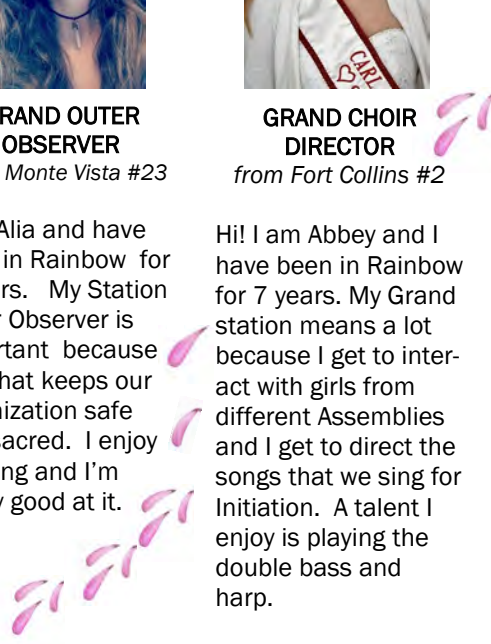
GRAND CHOIR DIRECTOR

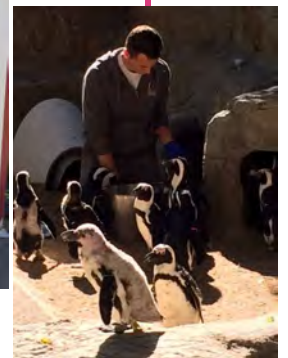

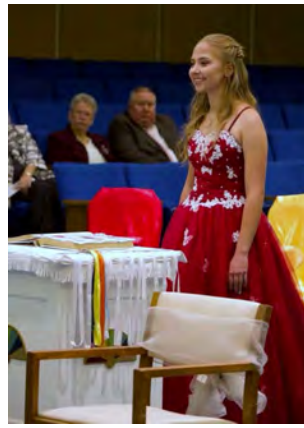

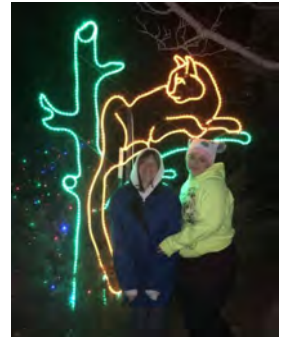
