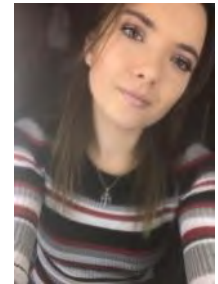
**GRAND Faith**

Rebekkah made the trek through the mountains to paint Rainbow rocks, and had fun with everyone.

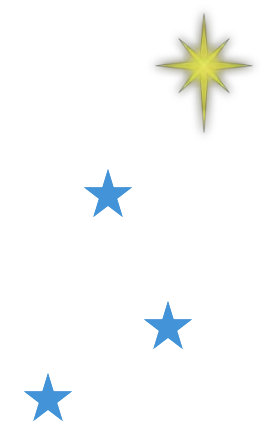
Abbey and Rebekkah

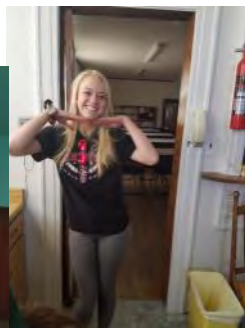
On May 29th, we will be cleaning up after the Shrine Circus. We look forward to seeing everyone at Grand Assembly in June.

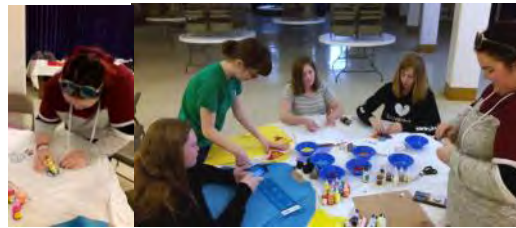
