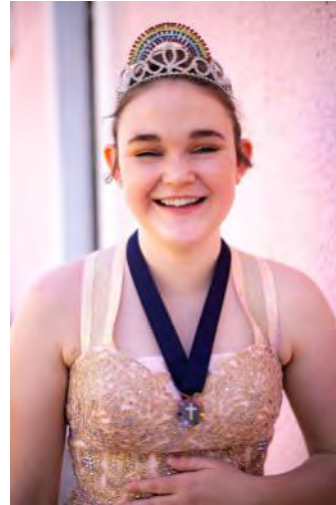

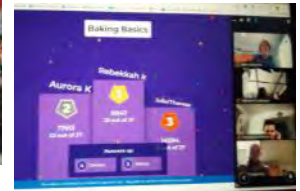

Mug Cake Ingredients

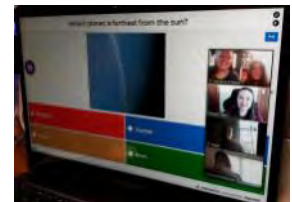
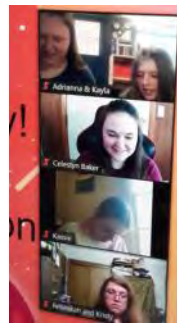
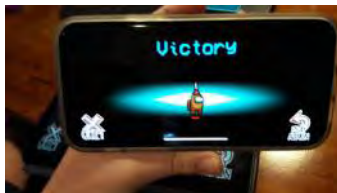
- 2 Tbsp all-purpose flour

Mix well in mug and microwave for 1 minute or until down.

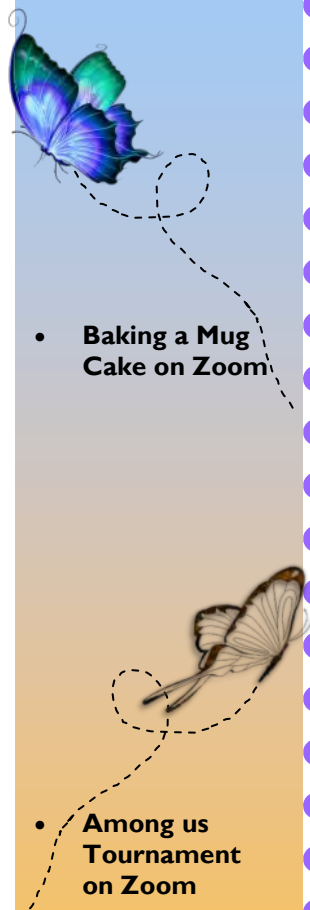

I was happy to be able to see some of you ladies at our ritual competition!

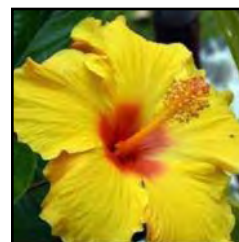

Remount Foundation

GWA Celestyn is so excited to share this foundation with us through one of her events. This foundation provides active-duty military, veterans, first responders and their families with free equine assisted therapeutic activities within a healing, natural environment connecting with the horses.

Remount Foundation grew out of necessity. Jeanne Springer and Billy Jack Barrett were working at the riding stables at the U.S. Air Force Academy with cadets and other military members when they began to realize the horses were helping injured veterans. Word got out around the Colorado Springs military community and soon wounded combat veterans were calling from all branches of service. Jeanne and Billy Jack have trained horses for decades, with the Remount Foundation culminating as the most fulfilling part of their life work.

The Remount Foundation vision is to provide a powerful, transformative experience through horses, nature and community that helps American Warriors achieve wellness physically, mentally and spiritually, to fulfill their God-given potential to be fathers, mothers and citizens of this great country.

A thousand acres are dedicated to the Academy Equestrian Center, and Springer believes that uncrowded space also helps the warriors.



“The fact that it’s on a military installation provides a sense of security, and just the ability to have

space to breathe that nature is healing,” she says. “They have space to just be, and let their minds be still.”

“We tell our warriors, ‘Come out here any time; you’re always welcome.’”

Remount operates five days a week, offering limited sessions on Saturdays and Sundays when the barns get busy. Individual sessions last about two hours. A session typically begins with selecting a horse in the herd to catch and halter, then grooming and an EAL exercise. Larger group sessions start with herd observation, then move to catching and haltering, and then grooming and riding, although not all participants want to ride and it’s



not required.

“Everybody has varying horse experience. Some come from a horse background and some are somewhat afraid of horses,” Springer says.

Small things can make big differences in what a warrior experiences as an individual, such as choosing a horse to halter, or having one choose them.



“When you groom a horse, that’s grounding,” Springer says. “I had a Marine come one day, and it was his first time to groom a horse. He just started crying. He looked at me and said, ‘I forgot what peace feels like.’ And he just cried.”



The EAL participants struggle with anxiety, depression, difficulty sleeping, anger, and guilt – all hallmark symptoms of PTSD. Springer estimates that Remount’s EAL sessions alone serve approximately 650 individuals annually. It is operating at capacity with a crew of about 40 volunteers and 25-30 horses.

More than 1001 warriors, veterans and their families have received help. Three of the methods they use to lead our heroes on the path to healing is Equine-Assisted Learning (EAL), Horse Boy, and Heart-math®.
